WISEatlantic hosted two Girls Get WISE Science Retreats for Girl Guides on March 1 and April 12, 2014. Both were a huge hit!


Dr. Franz-Odendaal held a workshop for science students at the Mount on how to improve their CV's for a science career on February 28, 2014

It has been a busy and rewarding two years and we have accomplished amazing things since 2011. We have engaged 1,735 girls with 149 female role models through our Girls Get Wise Retreats, Science Camps, role model panel sessions in local libraries, online webinars and school classrooms visits. We also hosted two professional development workshops (Becoming Leaders Workshop and Negotiating for Success) providing training to 33 women in STEM fields.
