The Women in Science and Engineering – Atlantic Region (WISEatlantic) program aims to shift gendered STEM stereotypes. We empower girls to consider Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM)-based careers by raising their awareness of the diversity of jobs within these fields, and enabling them to visualize themselves working in these fields. WISEatlantic also supports early career women in STEM through professional development and networking opportunities.

### SSTAR Sponsorship



#### Shifting Systems Today for the Advancement and Retention of Women in Science (SSTAR) Sponsorship

WISEatlantic is committed to the advancement and retention of women in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) professions. To foster this commitment, the WISEatlantic program is offering annual sponsorships (maximum \$1,500) to individuals so they may host an event or workshop targeted towards post secondary students and/or post-docs in Science programs in Atlantic Canada. To be eligible, the applicant must be an undergraduate, graduate student, post-doc in a Science field OR a faculty member from an Atlantic Canadian Academic Institution. The event or workshop must have a clear theme for the advancement and/or retention of women in Science.

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## What We've Been Up To:

### STEMaware Event Features Mount Science Alumnae



WISEatlantic and the Community SciMath Program at Mount Saint Vincent University co-hosted the first STEMaware event at the Mount on October 18<sup>th</sup>. This event brought together High School students in grades 9-12 with current Mount BSc students. The students had the opportunity to chat informally with Mount BSc Alumnae and learn more about their fields.

Prior to the students meeting Alumnae, the Mount's Career Services held a session for both High School students and Mount students that discussed STEM careers, the importance of networking, and preparing students with questions they could ask the alumnae.

Alumnae shared their current careers with students and how a degree in Science benefited their career paths. Thanks to everyone who came out for a great event - especially all our Mount Alumnae!

### Explore STEM Event for Aboriginal Youth

On November 16<sup>th</sup>, twenty-seven Aboriginal youth from across the province came to the Mount for a fun science exploration day. The youth participated in an engineering design challenge - building a windmill with limited resources. They also learned about a range of STEM careers by listening to STEM professionals from local aboriginal communities talk about their careers.

Several of the youth commented "it was really fun and I would love to come again".



The second Women in Science Speaker Tour for 2017-2018 is underway. Dr. Danielle Cox, Mathematician at the Mount, gave Research Seminars at UPEI November 6<sup>th</sup> and at St. FX. on November 20<sup>th</sup> entitled "Getting to the Root of the Problem". During the talk she explored reasons why roots are so interesting and some neat applications they have when studying graph theory problems.

Dr. Cox also did a Public Lecture at UNB Saint John on November 23<sup>rd</sup>; "The Mathematics of Puzzles & Games". There was a great turn-out for this event as she explored different hands-on games & puzzles and looked at how they relate to the mathematics we learn in elementary and junior high school. She also discussed how math is connected to current and exciting research

Dr. Nola Etkin, Chemistry Professor at UPEI will be doing our next Women in Science Speaker tour in the spring of 2018. Dates, titles and locations will be announced on our website when confirmed.

## WISEatlantic - A Year in Review & Five More Years!

2017 was a big year for WISEatlantic! The program was renewed for another five years and in June we celebrated the beginning of our next five-year term. We also expanded our camp program by offering a new Girls Get WISE Science Summer Camp for girls 15 & 16 years old, which we plan to continue for the next four years. 
This was the first year for the new Partnerships Program and we received six applications. The following three were successful in receiving funds for innovative programs in 2018:
